

## Standard Nib Sizes



### EF Extra Fine

Hard nib for extra fine lettering

For those who write using minute lettering, such as in diaries

\* For those who are learning pen calligraphy (for PILOT pen calligraphy course, also recommended by teachers)

Way of holding: In upright position



### F Fine

Hard nib for fine lettering

Wide range of uses, such as notebooks, diaries, letters, CVs (As first-time users tend to press down harder on the nib, fine lettering is recommended.)

Way of holding: Fairly upright



### FM Fine Medium

Hard nib for medium fine lettering

Notebooks, diaries, letters, CVs and a wide range of other uses

Way of holding: Fairly upright



### M Medium

Hard, medium lettering

For those who write letters or use slightly larger lettering



### B Broad

Bold lettering

For writing names and addresses on envelopes, signatures, etc.



### BB Broad Broad

Very bold lettering

For writing names and addresses on envelopes, signatures, etc.

## Soft-writing touch Nib Types



### SF Soft Fine

Soft-writing touch fine lettering

Since the nib gives a cushioned feel during writing, facilitates variations in lettering width.

For people who can only apply weak pen pressure

Way of holding: Slanted



### SFM Soft Fine Medium

Soft-writing touch medium lettering

Since the nib gives a cushioned feel during writing, facilitates variations in lettering width.

For people who can only apply weak pen pressure

Way of holding: Slanted



### SM Soft Medium

Soft-writing touch medium lettering

Since the nib gives a cushioned feel during writing, facilitates variations in lettering width.

For people who can only apply weak pen pressure

Way of holding: Slanted

## Special Nib Types



### S Signature

Lettering with very bold downstrokes and medium side strokes

Different in its curves and smooth writing touch, the writing width of this nib delivers lettering with flourishes. Writing touch and handwriting suited to signatures

Way of holding In slightly slanted position



### PO PO Posting

Extra-fine lettering with a downward-turned nib

Since the slit of the nib is narrow, well suited to fine lettering

Way of holding Upright



### FA Falcon

Super soft writing touch, imitates the feel of writing with a brush

Handwriting like a brush with a touch even softer than that of SF

Enables variations of line width emphasis. Not suited to those who press down heavily

Way of holding Slanted



### WA Waverly

Medium lettering with an upward-turned nib



### SU Stub

Medium fine lettering with broad downstrokes and thin side strokes



### C Coarse

Very bold lettering

Especially for those who like large letters, for



### MS Music

Especially bold for musical score and can also be used for design

Generally said to be for musical score use, but since the lettering width differs like that of an SU nib, can also be used like a calligraphy pen

Way of holding Upright

\* Falcon (FA) is intended for people who can only apply weak pen pressure.
